Life Skills Grades 1-2	Description
Handwriting Development	Students will work on letter formation, spacing, and eventually cursive writing for improved handwriting skills.
Introduction to Typing	Students will work on becoming familiar with the keyboard and identifying where the keys are and eventually type short sentences.
Focus and Concentration	Students will work on increasing their focus and concentration ability through various activities and curricula encouraging them to actively watch and listen.
Memorization	Students will work on getting into the habit of repetition, making connections, and breaking down the information in order to retain their information.
Listening Skills	Students will work on following directions, understanding stories, and responding appropriately to simple comprehension questions.
Understanding Money	Students will learn to recognize the value of coins, understand different values, counting coins, and eventually learn simple transactions.
Telling Time	Students will work on identifying what the hands of an analog clock read. They will learn the function of the hour hand and use “skip-counting” to read the minute hand.
Life Skills Grades 3-4	Description
Typing Class	Students will learn the proper posture and hand position while typing, typing without looking at the keyboard, and increasing their speed and accuracy.
Focus and Concentration	Students will learn how to work more independently, sustain their attention, shift their attention, and improve on following multi-step directions.
Memorization	Students will learn to remember facts, follow sequences, recall information, and build connections between new information and what they previously knew.
Listening Skills	Students will learn how to improve their active listening and be able to identify the main idea and pick out key details as they are listening.
Online Research	Students will learn how to identify reliable sources, ask good questions, use keywords, and navigate a website.
Multiplication Facts	Students will practice and master multiplication tables to improve speed and accuracy in problem-solving.
Life Skills Grades 5-6	Description
Typing Class	Students will learn to build their fluency and accuracy, develop advanced techniques (numbers, symbols, and punctuation marks), and learn how to apply typing to their academic tasks (writing an essay or creating a presentation).
Note-Taking Techniques	Students will learn how to identify key information, organize information, summarizing, paraphrasing, and reviewing.

Memorization	Students will learn how to use other memorization strategies, connect ideas, understand and apply information.
Online Research Skills	Students will learn how to evaluate search results, refine search queries, combine information from multiple sources, citing sources, and understanding plagiarism.
Time Management Skills	Students will learn to plan and prioritize assignments, estimate time, breaking down tasks, and being flexible and aware with their time.
Introduction to Budgeting	Students will learn to separate needs from wants and understand the importance and “how-to” of saving.
